Emma trained at the Perm State Choreographic School, Russia and worked as a member of the Corps de Ballet with Nizhny Novgorod State Theatre of Opera and Ballet. She has performed with all of the major companies in Ireland and is currently Associate Choreographer with CoisCéim Dance Theatre. She has choreographed for NAYD, Roundabout Youth Theatre, Upstate, Storytellers and IADT for St Patrick's Festival. Her work as Assistant Director includes *Midsummer Night's Dream* for Opera Ireland (2008) and *Macbecks* for Long Road Productions (2009). Earlier this year, Emma co-choreographed and performed *Four Told* at Project Arts Centre, Dublin and toured with her show *The Ballet Ruse* to venues throughout Ireland. Dance Europe voted her *Outstanding Dancer of the Year* for her performance in CoisCéim's *Faun*.


