Welcome to our informal showing of some of the work which was created for the 7th Choreography Project.

My mission with this intensive project was to allow all the participants to develop some skills as a direct route into making dance - using several triggers or tool box skills in physically responding to tasks. We all met for the first time as a group just last Tuesday evening. I asked the dancers to think of the first emotion that they felt when they woke up that morning. Next I asked for a movement to be made in a two count phrase that best physically described that emotion. Using all this material we then built a phrase out of all 16 emotions. This dance became the basis of some of the work here today.

We have put it together in a chance situation, so that the dance would have its own voice and hopefully capture some of the mood and creativity which happened over the week. The dancers are kinetically responding to each other in a dialogue and movement text which each dancer has created.

Thank you for joining us here today at CoisCéim and big thank you to the participants for their openness and creativity.

DAVID BOLGER

David is co-founder and Artistic Director of CoisCéim Dance Theatre. His work has been seen throughout Ireland and abroad and his recent choreographies include Faun, Swimming with my Mother, Cello Counterpoint and Touch Me. In 2001, he co-wrote and choreographed the award winning film Hit and Run which won the Paul Citron Award for Choreography for the Camera in the Moving Pictures Festival, Toronto and the Jury Prize in the Dance on Camera Festival at the Lincoln Centre, New York. He was also nominated for the American Choreography Award, LA. His most recent film Deep End Dance was commissioned under the Arts Council/RTÉ Dance on the Box scheme. It was nominated for an IFTA and won Best Short Film at the Boston Irish Festival. David has also worked with the Royal National Theatre, London, and received an Ivey Award in September for his work on HMS Pinaford at the Guthrie Theater, Minneapolis. In 2007, David was elected to membership of Aosdána, which honors artists whose work has made an outstanding contribution to the Arts in Ireland.

THE CHOREOGRAPHY PROJECT is the seventh initiative of this kind at CoisCéim. Now a regular feature of the CoisCéim Broadreach programme, it offers adults opportunity to work with professional choreographers in a creative environment and meet other people with an interest in the making of dance theatre.

• It is open to adult professional and non-professional dancers with a minimum of one year's experience in dance.




