TALKING COISCÉIM

What better way to usher in this shiny new decade than with a contemporary version of L'Après Midi d'un Faun – inspired by the most groundbreaking and provocative ballet of the 20th century? Tortured genius Vaslav Nijinsky may as well have thrown a hand-grenade into his 1912 bourgeois Parisian audience as flaunt his brat-like yet restrained erotic masterpiece before them. In one eleven-minute fell swoop he revolutionised dance, ushered in modernism, and also affronted the Parisian public with what they regarded as unadulterated, bestial sex. No wonder he was relegated to the category of "poète maudite", along with Mallarmé, whose languorous poem inspired Debussy's otherworldly score – another anthem of modernism. No wonder Jean Cocteau, August Rodin, and John Singer Sargent championed Nijinsky's feral physicality, immortalising the notorious artist in their work.

Prophetically, Nijinsky's restrained, two-dimensional gestures, barefoot walking, jutting hands and elbows, and isolated limbs, were more akin to the restrained rigour of Butoh than to the dazzling virtuosic feats expected of the Ballets Russes. Renowned for his ability to hover in the air, where were the legendary jumps and elevations by this extraordinary, virile poster-boy of the Ballets Russes? Where the traditional ballet arabesques and delicate prancing? And what exactly was Nijinsky at, Iving down on that nymph's scarf at the end? Were his measured, precise, pelvic thrusts, his ecstatic throwing back of the head, followed by satiated stillness, tantamount to – don't say it – masturbation? The only thing we know for sure is that Nijinsky's bold, unheralded celebration of the body, desire, and of natural sexuality sent Parisian audiences into apoplexy with outrage, and changed the face of dance forever. Sheer genius, in other words, and worth re-investigating, again and again.

Across Ireland nearly a century on, the rediscovery of our inner-Faun couldn't be more necessary. In the wake of the disturbing findings of the Ryan Report, the Murphy Report, and the Ferns Report [need I go on?], a masterpiece of the sensual is just the thing to set us off on a new trajectory into the "teenies". It's the zeitgeist: that scarf, those bursting grapes ... Yeah! Half goat, half human, "We are all once fauns in our lifetime, and it isn't so alien to us", grins choreographer David Bolger, mischievously of this deliciously ambiguous, mythical creature. The Faun, Bolger explains "is a follower of Bacchus, gets a little drunk and is having an afternoon hallucination. Was he dreaming? Was he not? Did he have this experience with two nymphs? I've left my version as soft and as moving as possible so you end up looking at skin on skin. Did they connect or did they not?" Tellingly, while Nijinsky played a lone faun among a gaggle of nymphs in 1912, Bolger has strewn his 2010 version with an entire cast of languid fauns in the afternoon, both male and female. Hm – could he be alluding to you and me?

In prelude to all this sensual archaeology and exploration, **As You Are** is an invitation to your inner child to come out and play again. Fifteen years on from the foundation of CoisCéim, Muirne Bloomer's exploration of childhood imagination, childhood games, and those childhood heroes lurking in our collective unconscious is another perfect starting point for a new beginning. Bring it on.

DAVID BOLGER ARTISTIC DIRECTOR | CHOREOGRAPHER

David is co-founder and Artistic Director of CoisCéim Dance Theatre. To date he has directed/choreographed Dances with Intent, Reel Luck, Straight With Curves, Hit and Run, Ballads, Toupees and Snare Drums, Dish of the Day, When Once is Never Enough, Boxes, Rite of Spring, Mermaids, Swept, Chamber Made, Nutcracker, Out of Harm's Way and Dodgems. His work has been seen throughout Ireland and in Europe, America, China and Australia. In 2001, David co-wrote and choreographed the award winning film Hit and Run which won the Paula Citron Award for Choreography for the Camera in the Moving Pictures Festival, Toronto and the Jury Prize in the Dance on Camera Festival at the Lincoln Centre, New York. He was also nominated for the American Choreography Award, LA.

David's large scale work includes A Dash of Colour for the Opening Ceremony at the Special Olympics [Dublin, 2003] and Intimate Details, a dance spectacle based on the human and animal ornamentation of The Book of Kells for the Opening Ceremony of the Ryder Cup [Kildare, 2006]. As a freelance choreographer, David created Ausserhalb der Gelfahrenzone! for the Tanztheater in Freiburg/Heidelberg. He works in theatre, opera and film in Ireland and overseas. His opera projects include: Orfeo Ed Euridice [Opera Ireland, 2004], which won an Irish Times/ESB award for best opera before going on to open the Maifestspiele in Wiesbaden. Other opera projects include Imeneo [Opera Ireland, 2005], also nominated for an Irish Times/ESB Award, La Traviata [English National Opera] and A Midsummer Night's Dream [Opera Ireland, 2008], Theatre projects include Sophie's Choice [Royal Opera House, London], Dancing at Lughnasa [TNM Montreal], The Coast of Utopia, The Relapse, Love's Labour's Lost and Man of Mode [Royal National Theatre, London], Martin Guerre [Cameron Mackintosh, UK & USA], Pirates of Penzance [Guthrie Theatre, USA], Sive [Druid Theatre] and Big Maggie, Tarry Flynn, The Colleen Bawn and The Secret Fall of Constance Wilde [Abbey Theatre]. During 2005/06 David worked on many projects with Druid Theatre including Sive. The Year of the Hiker and on the entire Synge Cycle: The Tinker's Wedding, Playboy of the Western World, Riders to the Sea, Deirdre of the Sorrows, The Well of the Saints and Shadow of the Glen.
