Welcome to CoisCéim Dance Theatre's performance of Touch Me.

In 1995, I made a new work titled **Reel Luck**, for the New Music New Dance Festival which looked at some of the issues that were then arising as Ireland was about to go on a journey into what is now known as the Celtic Tiger. 16 years later I went back to some of the material as a basis of this new work. **Touch Me**.

Over the last 12 months I set up interviews with many people about how they feel about our situation in Ireland today. I compiled ten questions which I asked as a background to my research for this piece. One of the many happy things I discovered about the answers was the incredible humanity that people shared with one another. At a time when news talks about the painful devastation of the economic crisis and what we may have lost. I noticed a huae amount of thinas people thought we may have gained, and the cyclical nature of history. It was very interesting to me that the first question I would ask people as an ice breaker was, "What makes you happy"? I was delighted to hear the response "Dancing" on many occasions.

My thanks to everybody who took part in the interviews and to the dancers for their personal input with physical stories and dialogue. I am honoured and humbled to be able to use dance as a tool to try to understand, to feel, to be touched by and physically respond to what is happening. In some ways **Touch Me** is not a comment, but rather a response through choreography to the accordion of emotions experienced daily. There is no doubt in my mind that the sheer breath of the material would never be able to be realised on stage. So my journey was one of enquiry, rather than of statement.

I am thrilled to welcome back to the company composer Kenneth Edge and his extraordinary talent as a musician. His music speaks from the soul with heartfelt accuracy. I am also delighted to have one of Ireland's finest theatre designers and artists Monica Frawley, alongside lighting designer lan Scott and Ivan Birthistle and Vincent Doherty who have carefully considered the visual and aural environment for tonight's performance.

Thank you to everybody who was part of making Touch Me and I hope that you will find happiness in our dance.

DAVID BOLGER DIRECTOR & CHOREOGRAPHER

David is co-founder and Artistic Director of CoisCéim Dance Theatre, David has directed and choreographed over 20 original productions for the Company, many of which have toured both nationally and internationally. receiving prestigious awards for their innovation, performance and choreography. The Company was awarded two coveted Fringe First Awards at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in 2006/2007. Recent productions for the Company include Cello Counterpoint. Swimming with my Mother, Faun, Dodgems, Out of Harm's Way, Chamber Made, Nutcracker, Swept, Mermaids, Boxes, Rite of Spring, When Once is Never Enough, Dish of the Day, Toupees and Snare Drums, Ballads, Hit and Run, Straight With Curves. Reel Luck and Dances with Intent. In 2001, David co-wrote and choreographed the award winning film Hit and Run with John Comiskey which received The Paula Citron Award for Choreography for the Camera at the Moving Pictures Festival, Toronto and The Jury Prize at The Dance on Camera Festival, Lincoln Centre, New York, David was also nominated for an American Choreography Award. David's most recent film, Deep End Dance, directed by Conor Horgan and produced by Wildfire Films, was nominated for an IFTA and won Best Short Film at the Boston Irish Film Festival. The film continues to screen at international film festivals and has recently been nominated for an IdiLL Film Award. David's direction in Opera includes, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Imeneo and Orfeo Ed Euridice, which received an Irish

Times Theatre Award for Best Opera Production in 2004. Other work in Opera Includes. choreography for Sophies Choice at The Royal Opera House, Covent Garden and Assistant Direction and Choreography for La Traviata at English National Opera. KENNETH EDGE COMPOSER & PERFORMER



Dublin Saxophonist Kenneth Edge is one of Ireland's leading and most innovative musicians, equally at home in many different musical genres. He studied with Sydney Egan in Dublin, John Harle in

London and Jean-Marie Londeix in Bordeaux. His music career began winning the 'RTÉ Young Musician of the Future' competition in 1983. Many awards followed, both for performance and composition. Kenneth's saxophone playing has inspired leading composers from different idioms to write new works for him, including John Buckley's **Concerto for Alto Sax and String Orchestra** which has been released on CD (Black Box) with Kenneth as soloist, joined by the Irish Chamber Orchestra. He is the featured

saxophone soloist on two movie soundtracks by the areat American film composer Elmer Bernstein: A Rage in Harlem and The Grifters. Kenneth has recorded Ronald Binge's Concerto and Eric Coates' **Saxo-Rhapsody** with the Slovak Radio Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Ernest Tomlinson and Andrew Penny respectively. on the Naxos label. A new Concerto by the Irish composer, Brian Byrne, which was commissioned by RTÉ for Kenneth, received its world premiere in 2010. Other recent Concerto highlights include a performance of Darius Milhaud's Scaramouche for Alto Sax and Orchestra with Kenneth as soloist with the Ulster Orchestra conducted by Jean-Luc Tingaud, and concertos with the RTÉ Concert Orchestra and the Irish Youth Wind Ensemble, Kenneth has held the post of 'Artist in Residence' at the University of Limerick. He is currently composing music to commemorate the Dalai Lama's visit to Ireland in 2011 as part of a U.L. commission. He has used the voice of his saxophone to great effect in the realms of Irish traditional and World music, collaborating with artists such as Micheál Ó Súilleabhain. Nikola Parov, Mairtín O Connor, Luka Bloom, Shaun Davey, Bill Whelan and Anuna. He was the original Saxophonist for **Riverdance** and Solo Clarinettist for the original Broadway production of Boublil and Schoenberg's - The Pirate Queen. Ken's previous work with CoisCéim includes compositions for **Dances with Intent**, Reel Luck and Straight with Curves. Compositions include Aerdha (Daahda Dance Company), Three smiles that are worse than grief for mixed choir commissioned by the University of Limerick. Unfolding into stillness for saxophone and dancer performed to commemorate the Dalai lamas visit to Ireland in 2011.


CLIVE WELSH STAGE MANAGER

CLASSES FOR PEOPLE AGED 50+ Weekly, drop-in classes run at St Teresa's Church, Clarendon Street, Dublin 2 each Monday 11.00 – 12.15pm led by Cathy Coughlan and Wednedays 2.00 – 3.30pm led by Philippa Donnellan. These classes are a relaxing and fun way to stay in shape. They combine easy stretch exercises and dance sequences to music which help maintain flexibility, strength, balance and coordination. The exercises can be done seated or standing. Each class lasts for up to 1½ hours and costs €5 per class.

THE CHOREOGRAPHY PROJECT Open to people interested in the choreographic process through to performance. Participants meet two-three times weekly over 6-8 weeks and are mentored by a professional choreographer to develop their own choreographic voices. Led by Muirne Bloomer, the sixth Choreography Project is currently underway and with participants taking the themes of Touch Me as a starting point to creating their own choreography.

COISCÉIM CREATIVE STEPS: A DANCE THEATRE GROUP FOR PEOPLE AGED 15-25
